

Bringing Guests to Our Lodge

Changes need to be made, whether major or minor. Our Lodge needs to conform to Our By-Laws and the Statutes Annotated that govern our Lodge.

Our Lodge has been on a decline in member participation and membership recruitment for too long. We all need to be reminded of the Obligation and Oath that we swore to uphold when we were initiated into our Lodge and this Great Order of Elks. Maybe we need to attend Initiation on annual basis.

Our Lodge is becoming known as a club, rather than what is to be properly recognized as, The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks. We need to get into the habit of showing our Membership Card to the bartender every time you enter. It doesn't matter if they know you or not, please SHOW YOUR CARD. It will protect the Lodge, you and the bartender, if there is a question. If you bring a guest in, you must sign them in.

Now I refer to our By-Laws and Statutes Annotated to address concerns. Please keep reading so that you DON'T EMBARRASS YOURSELF or YOUR GUEST.

By-Laws, House Rule #5- Lodge Functions. The Exalted Ruler will Designate those Lodge Functions as "members only" or "members and guests".... When guests are welcome, they will be allowed to this privilege only twice a year. These guests will be required to sign the Guest Book.... All guests MUST be accompanied by a current member.

Statutes Annotated: Section 14.120, Absolute Dimit. A member, who shall receive an Absolute Dimit or is dropped for non-payment of dues, shall become an Unaffiliated Member.

Section 14.190, An Unaffiliated Member shall not be permitted to visit a Lodge.

Section 14.130, A Member in good standing shall have the same and equal privileges....with every other Member of their Lodge, except as otherwise provided. Opinion 03, A Member who is delinquent in payment of dues is not entitled to use the club facilities or attend meetings of the Lodge.

Upholding these Articles in Reference will bring back prestige, increase member participation, and membership in our Lodge. If WE ALL work toward this, it will happen. We are the top fraternal organization in the United States of America. Let's keep it that way!

Be proud you're an Elk. Promote our good deeds. Recruit new members. Only you, the members of our Lodge can keep our Lodge running by upholding our Constitution, Statutes of Our Order, and the By-Laws of Our Lodge. Please protect our Lodge and yourself by conforming to and re-familiarizing yourself with our rules.

Donor Gives New Meaning to Benevolence

First, I want to thank the members here for giving me this public recognition of my contributions to the Elks National Foundation. I would like to make a few comments at this time about

the importance of this Foundation to all Elks.

When I joined the Elks back in the '70s, I listened to the Oregon City Lodge's ENF Chairman's presentation about the first word in our organization's title: Benevolence. He made a great impression on me. As I was not able to attend the meetings or other Lodge programs regularly, it seemed to me I could participate in the benevolent work of the Elks by contributing to the Elks National Foundation. I started as many of you have done, by pledging \$10 a month until I reached \$100. Then, I thought, why not continue to contribute as our family budget allowed.

Over the years, I continued to contribute \$10 a month and then gave more each month as our budget allowed. I was surprised to find out that by 1995, I had given \$5,000. Over the past 10 years, I have given another \$5,000 for a total of \$10,000. My wife and I are not rich in any sense of the word. We gave as our budget allowed because we feel this is a very important part of our Lodge's purpose and something we believe in. We say "Elks Care, Elks Share." A checker at the Florence Bi-Mart asked me about the pins I wear on my Elks jacket. When I mentioned the Elks National Foundation as one of the pins, she said that if it hadn't been for the scholarship from the Elks National Foundation, her daughter couldn't have gone to college. This shows that we do receive benefits in our own community when we support the ENF. Also, the Elks National Foundation, through the Community Investments Program, now returns money to each individual Lodge, if the Lodge applies for it; so again, we are helping ourselves as well as others in Elkdom.

I have received years of joy thinking of all the help this money has given to others. I hope you will join me in this program and again bring great meaning to the word "benevolence."


