***WHAT IT MEANS TO BE AN ELK***

The **Benevolent & Protective Order of Elks** had it's beginnings on February 16th, 1868, when the 15 original "Jolly Corks" met in Military Hall in New York City to form the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, The Great Order, which has grown to over 1.2 million members, is now in it's 132nd year. It has touched the lives of the great and the small through the years, helping to heal the domestic wounds of a civil war, reaching out to the unfortunate during countless national disasters. It's membership, rising from the Jolly Corks, a group of budding thespians and artists, has grown to include many well known entertainers, professionals from all walks of life . . . from doctors and lawyers, from plumbers to politicians. It includes the people next door, and several former Presidents of the United States. This great fraternity appeals to the "achievers" of this country, proving once again that "no-one stands so tall as when they stoop to help a child".

General Revision of the By-Laws for the Lodge are due in October, this is mandatory every five years. The following proposed By-Laws and House Rules revisions or additions were read at the Wednesday, August 27th Lodge meeting and will be made a special order of business at the Wednesday September 10, 2008 meeting. At that time discussion, amending and a vote on the proposed revisions and additions will be held.

By-Laws:

1. Proposed addition after Sec 1a as Section 2;

Indemnification and hold harmless the Officers and Trustees

To the fullest extent permitted by law, this Subordinate Lodge of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks does hereby agree to hold and save any and all Officers of Trustees of this Lodge ("Indemnitee") free and harmless from all expenses, claims, liabilities, losses, judgments or damages, including reasonable attorney fees ("Losses") which said Indemnitee may suffer or incur as a result of injury, loss or damage to person or property by reason of any cause whatsoever, arising in whole or in part, from the performance of their duties where said Indemnitee is carrying out the provisions of the Statutes or the Laws of the Benevolent and Protective order of Elks or acting under the express or implied directions of the Subordinate Lodge. This agreement shall apply whether the Losses arise in whole or in part because of the active or passive negligence of the Indemnitee and shall exist except where the Losses arise because of the willful misconduct of the Indemnitee with intent to injure a person.

2. Article IV: Sessions Section 1; currently reads:

The regular sessions of this Lodge shall be held on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month throughout the year, except that in months of July and August, sessions of the Lodge shall be held on the second Wednesday evening of each thereof.

Proposed Revision Section 1;

The regular sessions of this Lodge shall be held on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month throughout the year, except that in the months of July and August and December, sessions of the Lodge shall be held on the second Wednesday evening of each thereof.

3. Article X: Fees and dues Section 3: Currently reads:

The reinstatement fee for an Elk holding an absolute demit from this lodge shall be \$54.

The affiliation fee for an Elk holding a transfer demit from another lodge shall be \$54.

The affiliation fee for an Elk holding an absolute demit from another lodge shall be \$54.

The fee for affiliation for an unaffiliated Elk holding a certificate of release from another lodge shall be \$108.

Proposed Revision Section 3:

The reinstatement fee for an Elk holding an absolute demit from this lodge shall be \$20.

The affiliation fee for an Elk holding a transfer demit from another lodge shall be \$20.

The affiliation fee for an Elk holding an absolute demit from another lodge shall be \$20.

The fee for affiliation for an unaffiliated Elk holding a certificate of release from another lodge shall be \$20.

(The reasoning behind this is the fact that the members have paid fees to their current lodges and our fees are way above the average.)

4. House Rules revisions

A. Rule 9; Add the title Animals to the rule.

B. Rule 15; (Third from last sentence)

Currently reads; There will be a service charge of \$10.00 on all returned checks.

Revision Rule 15; There will be a service charge of \$25.00 on all returned checks.

5. Proposed new House Rules

A. Beverages: No beverage may be taken out of the west lounge by a member or guest when there is a private function being held in the dining hall or east lounge. No Member, nor his/her guest, will interfere with any private function held at the lodge.

B. Sexual Harassment section added. It can be added to the end of the Articles with a new number. It can also be added to the House rules. About all it has to say is that the lodge has adopted the Grand Lodge sexual harassment policy.

C. RV Parking: The minimum charge for Recreational Vehicle parking shall be \$15.00 per 24 hour or any part thereof.


