A MESSAGE FROM THE ESTEEMED LEADING KNIGHT — Karen Wells

I would like to introduce everyone to our 2014-2015 California-Hawaii Elks Major Project theme child, Ethan Kempton.

Ethan was born on June 16, 2006 two weeks premature. When born, Ethan suffered oxygen deprivation due to his umbilical cord being tightly wrapped around his neck.

After spending a full week in Neonatal Intensive Care, Ethan was released to go home without a clear cut diagnosis of his health challenges. Weeks and months passed before it was evident he was severely delayed developmentally. Severe crossed eyes, inattentive behavior, lack of clear speech abilities, overall lack of coordination, and little ability to crawl, sit and walk in a timely manner.

Ethan was almost 4 years old before the neurologist finally diagnosed him with having moderate Cerebral Palsy and a number of other physical, developmentally and psychological issues.

Ethan's parents, Danny and Janelle Kempton not only struggle to care for Ethan, but Ethan's two older brothers Taylor 11 and Cameron 10. It wasn't until 2011 that Ethan was referred to the Elks Major Project.

Immediately Ethan was assigned an Occupational Therapist, Mavis Johnson who has helped him with his severe language and speech delays, motor skills and basic day to day activities that most of us take for granted.

Ethan and his family have overwhelming love and admiration for Mavis Johnson and the generosity of the Elks Major project.

It was a great pleasure to meet Ethan and his family. I must say it was a humbling experience to witness first hand the money donated to the purple pig at work. INSPIRING!!!!

So please the next time you see the purple pigs on the tables, know your spare change can alter the lives of children.




A MESSAGE FROM THE ESTEEMED LOYAL KNIGHT—Rod Riggins






