Proposed By-law and House Rules revisions and proposals Woodland 1299 September 2013

By-laws

No. 1 General revision and updating of by-laws to meet the requirements of the Grand Lodge Annotated Statutes.

No. 2 Updating individual sections of Woodland 1299 by-laws.

Article III: Life Membership

Section 2: Addition

2a. A maximum of (ten percent) 10% of the current Lodge membership may be elected to life membership at any given time. All requests for life membership must be in writing to the Lodge Secretary who will keep a list of all requests. Members will be notified in the order the requests are received for balloting, when the total life membership of section 2 falls below the percentage selected.

Article IV: Sessions

Section 1: currently reads:

The regular meetings of this Lodge shall be held on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month throughout the year, except that in the months of July and August, meetings of the Lodge shall be held on the second Wednesday evening of each thereof.

Proposed Revision

Section 1;

The regular Lodge meetings of this Lodge shall be held on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month throughout the year, except that in the months of July and August the regular lodge will be held on the second (2nd) Wednesday of July and the fourth (4th) Wednesday of August.

Sec. 2: currently reads:

The regular hour of meeting shall be 8:00 o'clock p.m.

Proposed Revision:

The regular hour of meeting shall be 7:30 p.m.

Article IV-A: Exemplification of Rituals;

Proposed addition:

The officers of this lodge are authorized to use alternative forms of the Opening, Closing and Initiatory Rituals as approved by Grand Lodge. At any time, the Lodge may utilize the original rituals. The Presiding Officer of the meeting and/or Initiation Ritual would determine which form (original or shortened) would be used during that meeting.

Article V: Elective Officer and duties;

Proposed;

Section 1b; The Exalted Ruler, Leading Knight, Secretary and Chairman of the Board of Trustees shall attend the California-Hawaii Elks Association Annual Convention and Mid-Term Conference. The lodge shall pay for registration, event fees, transportation and per diem allowance in an amount not less than the amount set forth by Grand Lodge for such year, or any part thereof which is not paid for by another source. This allowance is to cover those days actually spent in attendance at such sessions and for necessary travel to and from.

Section 4; OF THE SECRETARY- Fifth (5th) Paragraph, last sentence)

Current;

For the faithful performance of his duties he shall receive as compensation \$4500.00 per annum, payable bi-weekly.

Proposed;

For the faithful performance of his duties he shall receive as compensation \$7200.00 per annum, payable bi-weekly.

Addition to same paragraph:

He/she must be computer literate, and knowledgeable in Microsoft Word, Excel and Publisher, or comparable programs.

Section 7; Of the Trustees or Board of Directors

Currently reads: 2nd Paragraph It shall hold at least one monthly meeting each month

Proposed: It shall hold at least one monthly meeting on the third (3rd) Wednesday of each month and needed

special meetings called by the Chairman.

Add to 5th Paragraph:

All arrangements for the borrowing of Lodge equipment (property) must be made through the Trustees/ Board of Directors. No one else has the authority to loan any equipment, or property belonging to the Lodge

Article IX; Club Operation and Management;

Sec. 3, second paragraph

Currently reads; The supervising or managing body shall hold one regular meeting each month and needed special meeting called by the Chairman.

Proposed; The supervising or managing body shall hold one regular meeting on the third (3rd) Wednesday of each month and needed special meetings called by the Chairman.

Article X: Fees and dues

Section 1; Current:

The fee for initiation into this Lodge for an applicant who has passed his twenty- sixth birthday shall be \$100.00, \$50.00 to accompany the proposition and the balance to be paid when candidate presents himself for initiation.

Proposed;

The fee for initiation into this Lodge for an applicant who has passed his twenty-sixth birthday shall be \$50.00, \$25.00 to accompany the proposition and the balance to be paid when the candidate presents himself for initiation.

Section 2.

Current:

The fee for initiation into this Lodge for an applicant making application prior to his twenty-sixth birthday shall be \$100.00, \$50.00 to accompany the proposition and the balance to be paid when candidate presents himself for initiation.

Proposed;

The fee for initiation into this Lodge for an applicant making application prior to his twenty-sixth birthday shall be \$50.00, \$25.00 to accompany the proposition and the balance to be paid when candidate presents himself for initiation.

Section 4.1st paragraph, Last sentence;

Current;

Before such reinstatement, the applicant shall pay to the lodge a reinstatement fee of \$108.00 dollars and in addition thereto, a proportionate share of the current dues, prorated in the same manner as the dues of a new member, together with any indebtedness owing to the Lodge or Club.

Proposed;

Before such reinstatement, the applicant shall pay to the lodge a reinstatement fee of \$20.00 dollars and in addition thereto, a proportionate share of the current dues, prorated in the same manner as the dues of a new member, together with any indebtedness owing to the Lodge or Club.

Proposed: new 2nd paragraph;

During the two (2) consecutive months of September and October of each year, the fee for reinstatement in this lodge of a member stricken from the rolls of this Lodge for non-payment of dues shall be one (1) dollar.

HOUSE RULES.

No. 2

Employees:

Sentence #3 currently reads: Employees are prohibited from drinking alcoholic beverages while on duty. Members shall not offer to employees such beverages or in any way encourage or aid them in the consumption of such beverages while on duty.

Proposed: Employees and/or volunteers serving alcoholic beverages are prohibited from drinking alcoholic beverages while on duty. Members shall not offer to employees and/or volunteers such beverages or in any way encourage or aid them in the consumption of such beverages while on duty.




